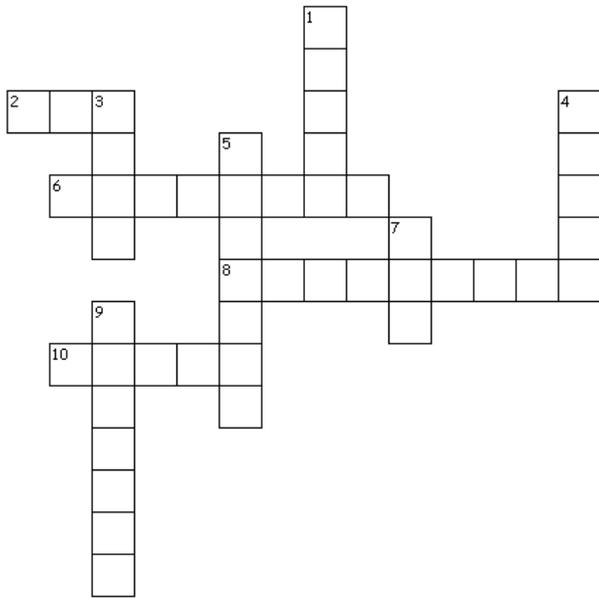

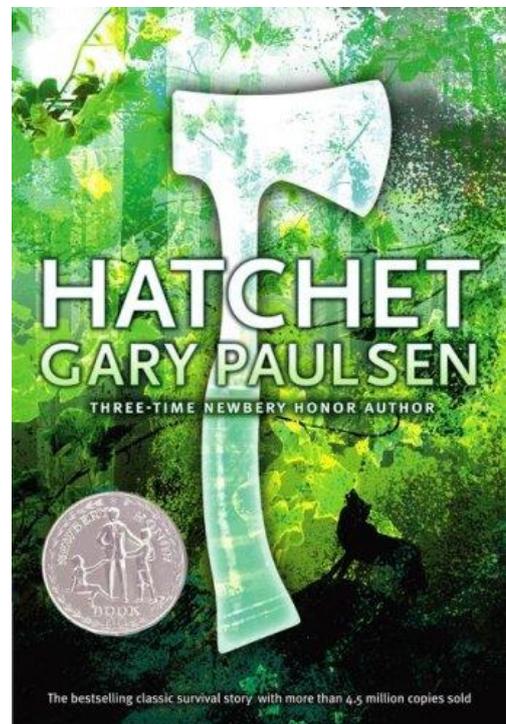

These quests allow entry into different parts of the large world or give different supplies and sometimes reward you with some money.

There is also a very interesting multiplayer option where you can invite up to 16 other players from all over the world to help you fight the zombies and win. During the game you set up a camp where you live and can invite the other players into. This camp can be raided by zombies and you can upgrade defenses and things like this.

The game also has crafting in it where you can create weapons, food and other items to help you survive as long as possible. You can level up your character and make it unique from all the others as you change its skills and looks. If you die don't worry about the game getting boring as the new world you create will be randomized and will never be the same.

The game supports English, Russian, French, Spanish, German and Italian so, you can play the game even if you don't understand English (Although I can't understand how you are reading this review if you can't understand it). This game cannot be played without steam but, this makes it easier to get it on any computer and makes it easier to connect with your friends when playing the game. This game also

supports steam achievements which makes the game much more interesting to play.
